## **Message Meditation**

## January 25, 2015

Text: Obadiah

## Message Meditation:

- 1. God's word to Edom: Judgment is coming against them.
  - a. War (v.1); Despised (v.2); Deceived (v.3); brought down (v.4).
  - b. Thieves and harvesters don't take everything. Edom will be plundered completely (v.5-6).
  - c. Allies will become enemies (v.7).
  - d. God will act against them (v.8-9).
- 2. Edom's evil activity:
  - a. No help to their brothers (Israel) in their time of distress (v.10-11)
  - b. Joined in with Israel's enemies (v.11).
  - c. Gloated and rejoiced in Israel's fall (v.12-13).
  - d. Looted Israel after their defeat (v.13).
  - e. Violently handed over fugitives to their captives (v.14).
- 3. As certain as Edom's non-existence today is the coming day of the Lord's judgment upon all the nations (v.15)!
  - a. The coming day of the Lord will be a day of divine retributive justice (v.15-16).
  - The day of justice upon the nations will also be a day of escape for God's people (v.17-18).
- 4. Jerusalem will endure forever. In the New Heavens and New Earth, Jerusalem will possess all the promised land and the nations will bring their glory into it. (v.19-21).
- 5. The Kingdom shall be the Lords! (v.21)

## Message Application:

- 1. What we learn about God:
  - a. God does what He says.
  - b. God is able to discipline and defend His people.
  - c. God loves justice and mercy.
  - d. God rules over the nations that presently rule over us.
- 2. What we learn for ourselves:
  - a. Our greatest need is to be a citizen in God's Kingdom.
    - i. We were born citizens of an earthly kingdom.
    - ii. We must be born again, born from above, to be a citizen in God's Kingdom.
    - iii. Jesus makes rebirth possible. Jesus is the object of our faith. Jesus is our eternal hope.
  - b. As God's kingdom citizens, our greatest priority is to represent God and the values of His kingdom no matter the kingdom we find ourselves living in today.
    - i. 1 Peter 2:9-17; Romans 12-13

- 3. Questions for personal application:
  - a. How does pride lead us to placing our trust in something other than God?
  - b. What are the particular challenges of living as a citizen in God's kingdom as an earthly citizen of a powerful nation in the present world scene?
    How would those challenges be different if we were a citizen in a nation that has no power or global significance?
  - c. What are some values that you hold to and strongly defend that may not be a significant value in God's kingdom?
    - What are some values of God's kingdom that need a higher place in your life?
