Message Meditation March 1, 2015

Text: **Zephaniah**

Message Meditation:

- 1. Zephaniah the prophet is also a prince a descendant of the great King Hezekiah. Zephaniah's ministry was during the reign of King Josiah, who led the nation of Judah in a national revival. Zephaniah's message was that God was going to soon come and discipline the nation of Judah for their sin.
 - a. Zephaniah saw beyond the outward conformity to Josiah's revival.
 - b. Zephaniah saw beyond his day:
 - i. To the soon-coming discipline upon Judah.
 - ii. To the ultimate day of the Lord when the Lord would judge all wickedness and restore and dwell among His people.
- We don't see well beyond our day but we do know there is another day of the Lord coming.
 Jesus plainly communicated that He was coming again, a claim all the New Testament authors repeated.
 - a. The return of Jesus is an anticipated day of great glory, awe and wonder for those who believe Him.
 - b. The return of Jesus is a day of distress, anguish and devastation for those who have ignored Him and rejected His salvation.
- 3. Are you prepared for Jesus' return? Are you preparing for Jesus' return? Two points of examination from Zephaniah 1:
 - a. Zephaniah 1:4-8: Are you swearing by the Lord...and by something else?
 - Swearing by the Lord, and by something else, practically makes the Lord irrelevant. If something is added to the Lord then He is not sought after or pursued.
 - ii. If you know God, then you know He is not replaceable and His salvation is sufficient.
 - b. Zephaniah 1:12: Are you living like God is a do-nothing God?
 - i. Complacent living comes from the misguided belief that God is a do-nothing God.
 - ii. When God's grace and patience is interpreted as God's permissiveness, it results in complacent living.
 - iii. The cross tells us God is not a do-nothing God. God's past judgments and deliverances communicate that God is not a do-nothing God.
 - iv. When we live unaffected by God, we tell the world that God is unaffecting.
- 4. Preparing for the coming day of the Lord involves repenting from (a) adding to Jesus, and (b) living as if God doesn't matter.

Message Application:

- 1. Are you prepared for Jesus' return? Is your faith in Him alone for your salvation?
- 2. Are you preparing for Jesus' return? Are you living by faith in Him today?
- 3. Examining your life, would people assume that God is active or apathetic?
