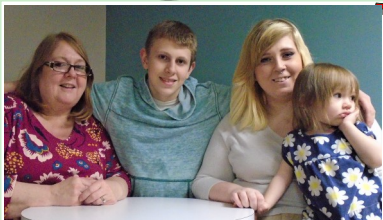

After their "nice" rental home started to have serious problems with an unresponsive landlord, Deb and Kaitlin considered moving to Ypsilanti to be with a relative, but that was prevented when their car broke down permanently.

Previously, Deb had been hired by the mission but left without notice. "That bothered me. "When I saw Meredith (food service manager), she hugged me and broke the ice." Everyone here showed her that kind of grace and forgiveness. This time Deb will not rush because she knows this is a safe place for her family, and Kaitlin has joined the SAVE Program and is studying for her GED.

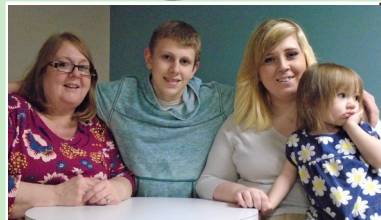
