More than anything they desired to live, by His enabling grace, "not for themselves but for Him who died for them".

Paul and Faith were married after graduating from Waukesha Bible School. They were eager to complete the training with NTM/Ethnos360 and live out their lives in a needy corner of this world, where they could carry out "The Great Commission". They have been able to give abundant testimony of God's grace, mercy and love down through these 50 plus years, never dreaming that God would take them to three different Latin American countries! They have endeavored to follow His direction and leading

The Wyma's had the profound joy of engaging with the indigenous Ayore people of Bolivia, S.A. for 10 years, witnessing God's faithfulness in "calling out a people for His name". They rejoice today for the part the Master gave them in establishing the church among many groups of these people.

After prayerfully considering the request from the Executive Committee of NTM/Ethnos360 they moved to Mexico to help provide leadership for this newly opened field. They served there for twelve years and witnessed the Lord's provision of 45 additional families joining them and establishing five different tribal works, actively carrying out God's commission to the church.

Next, Paul and Faith found God leading them to join the faithful teams serving in Paraguay. Once again, the executive board of the mission asked if they would be willing to assist that field. It was their privilege to learn from these dedicated servants of Christ and join with them in reaching the God-given objectives in that needy country. What a joy they had, serving with highly motivated brothers and sisters.




