We, like you, have been under stay at home orders. We have been in a particularly trying time. As you may recall, our home in Saginaw was sold in early March. Then the shutdown occurred for two weeks and then a month. For some reason the buyers were able to have an inspection and closing but we are not allowed to look at houses

Our written agreement with the buyers required us to be out before April 24. But movers were not allowed to come into our house to move the big stuff. We intended to buy a house south west of Lansing where the mission believed we may have a more affective ministry to local churches. But with the stay at home orders real estate was shut down except for online purchases. We wanted to see and feel what we were buying. But THE LORD PROVIDES. We are not homeless.

Our Bible school in Jackson closed and went to online classes at the shutdown. The Bible school has rented us a house in Jackson until we can get relocated. It is a blessing to be here as this school moves to the Waukesha campus. Our Father had all of this in His plan.

Answers to questions you may have 1. How did you get your stuff to the new location? That happened with lots of trips in a car and even more in the van. 2. How about the furniture? Two guys from the school came and moved the big stuff with us out of the house. 3. What about the meetings for the spring and summer. Our plans are cancelled. God's plan is still at work. 4. What about the trips to Wayumi.? We don't know is the best answer that we can give. We have been in contact with pastors and realize that many of them are in unknown areas just like us. Please pray with us that Wayumi is able to move forward. We have been following the social distance, face mask and glove compliance orders and are staying well. We are thankful to know who has us in His hands.

FUTURE PLANS: We hope to relocate from Jackson to a more permanent location this summer. We are hoping to still get a group to Wayumi in July and restart our meetings. So far the IFCA convention in June is still on and we plan to represent Ethnos360.
